Well it's almost April 2015 already and there has been a lot of change and progress within the small scale mining industry and platform.

I would also like to thank Garnet Ross for his commitment to the role as the QSMA president during his term and wish him all the best.

Secondly, I would like to introduce Bradley (Brad) Eddy who commenced as the new Principal Mining Registrar in the Emerald DNRM office back in January 2015. I would also like to acknowledge the dedication and hard work that the QSMA executive, in particular Greg Charlton, has undertaken in the recent months to formulate and create an ancillary agreement for the use by QSMA members. Greg has worked tirelessly to see this project through to fruition in the interest of QSMA members and has sought clarification and assistance from this office throughout this long process. Well done Greg.

In November 2014 further applications within MMOL was released including new applications. Whilst the use of MMOL is slowly increasing further training in these new processes will be provided to the QSMA executive over the coming months to enable them to provide assistance, guidance and a service to members wishing to use the online environment. An example of a success story using MMOL is that a transfer application was lodged, assessed and approved with 5 business days.

On Thursday 19 March 2015 both Brad Eddy and I met with the QSMA executive at length in Sapphire to discuss members concerns and issues around the Gemfield's in general. The meeting was extremely positive resulting in both parties understanding each other's genuine issues and as an action item committed to continue and meet every two months.

It is a timely reminder to all to ensure that you are aware of your legislative requirements in accordance with the conditions provided for each of your mining tenements (IE Mining Claim, Mining Lease and Prospecting Permit). Of late there have been a number of issues resulting in holder's not complying with these conditions. Upon investigation it was established that in most instances it was merely a misunderstanding of, or not being aware of, conditions subject to individual mining tenements. In any case if you are unsure of your obligations please contact the QSMA for advice or the Emerald DNRM office.

If I don't get a chance to write to you all again before Gemfest 2015 I look forward to seeing you all there.

Provision of Security (Secutiry Deposits)

Regarding Security Deposits on mining claims: You may or may not be aware, The Mineral Resources Act 1989 (Current as of 1^{st} Oct 2014), Chapter 3-Mining Claims, section 83, **provision of security**.

The provision of security deposited by the holder of that mining claim has reasonable security for compliance and rectification of the said mining claim.

We bring to your attention section 83:-

(10) The Minister may accept a bond or a guarantee or indemnity by, or other financial arrangement with, a financial institution, insurance company or other credit provided approved by the Minister or other form of security acceptable to the Minister as the whole or part of the security to be deposited under this section.

Please contact your financial institution for further information regarding guarantee or indemnity.

NATIVE TITLE CO-ORDINATORS REPORT

The Right To Negotiate/Ancillary Agreement

Greetings to all our members. Since our last newsletter the negotiation process has moved forward as Tenure Holders in advertising batches 1, 2 and 3 are now aware.

On the 6th of February 2015 I had a meeting in Rockhampton with the Western Kangoulu People and their Legal Representatives. The meeting was informal but at the same time informative. A number of topics were discussed, the different types of mining, the Ancillary Agreement, the way forward and the best outcome.

On the 24th March 2015 the QSMA Draft Ancillary Agreement was forwarded onto the Bidjara People #7 and their representatives.

On the 25th March 2015 I had a telephone conference with the NNTT (National Native Title Tribunal) in regards to the mediation process, our understanding of this process and our obligations. The Teleconference I am pleased to say went well.

As from May 27th and May 28th 2015, face to face negotiations with the Western Kangoulu People and the Bidjara People #7 will start and the QSMA is confident that these meetings will be progressive. I would like to inform all members that as we are now entering the Right To Negotiate phase, your Negotiating Team is now bound by a Confidentiality Clause, however that being said, we will keep you all informed as best as we can. Watch this space.
