# OUR WANING HERITAGE

## THE EUREKA REBELLION

When the gold miners on the Ballarat Gold Fields revolted due to the expense of a miners licence, taxation via the licence without representation and the actions of the Government, the Police and Military the Ballarat Reform League was formed by the miners.

As tyranny and oppression continued by their Colonial Masters the miners now referred to as rebels, on the 3rd of December 1854 took up arms at a stockade located on Bakery Hill on the Eureka Lead. This became known as the Eureka Stockade.

Here the shortest battle in history was fought resulting in the deaths of 27 combatants mostly rebels.

The immediate result of this "little rebellion" was a public reaction against Hotham and his secretary Foster, which led to the latter's resignation. License hunting became almost non-existent, and the Victorian jury convened to adjudicate the trial of 13 miners acquitted all but one: Henry Seekamp, the editor of the Ballarat Times. He was sentenced to six months for seditious libel.

The Gold Fields Royal Commission led to reform of the laws, and gave the miners almost everything they had asked for. The gold license was abolished and replaced by a miner's right costing one pound per year. Possession of this gave the digger a right to mine gold, and vote in the elections for parliament. Lalor and Humffray were elected unopposed in 1855 to the Legislative Council, and the former became Speaker of the House of Assembly in 1880.

#### PRESIDENT/NATIVE TITLE CO-ORDINATERS REPORT

Greetings to all Members new and long term. The first thing I would like to do is thank those Members and Non-Members who have donated not only money but items for the raffles that we are conducting, proceeds are going to the QSMA Building Fund. You know who you are. The QSMA and its committee thank you whole heartedly.

The QSMA would like to remind its members that any Sapphires that have undergone any treatment to enhance the stone must be disclosed. The Gemfields are dependant on Tourism for its longevity. The QSMA foresees a bright future for the Australian Sapphires and the Industry as a whole. Nothing travels faster than bad news.

Unfortunately several people have made it known that they would like to see Tourists and Fossickers out of the area and this attitude is astounding. The Gemfields is a Tourist Destination and a lot of time, effort and money has been spent by various Organisations and Local Businesses as of late to promote the Gemfields to Tourists. Whether you live on Freehold, an MHPL or you, like myself are a miner, the Gemfields is a community and as Community the actions of a minority will affect the lives of the majority. To the person/persons who is/are harassing the campers in the 48 hour camping area, the only thing you have managed to achieve is to give Sapphire the reputation of being an unfriendly tourist town and area. This is just what local businesses don't need. Think about your actions very carefully as this also affects you.

The Sunday Markets are well under way again for the season and the QSMA will be there at our regular stall. Questions and concerns can be raised and answered at the time and if we are unable to answer your question we will research it and get back to you as soon as we can. #### Myminesonline: (MMOL)

We are still processing Renewals & Transfers for members through MMOL, please have as much information as possible when renewing or transferring as this makes the job easier for both you and us. When we have competed further training generously offered by the Department, and have an Office, we hope to train other members to help with this process.

#### **Meetings:**

The General Meeting held by the QSMA at the Sapphire Community Centre on the 15<sup>th</sup> April 2015 as previously advertised in our last newsletter was well attended with over sixty people present. Topics covered were: Right to Negotiate, History of the QSPA & QSMA, The positive meeting with Department of Natural Resources & Mines John Tolhurst & new Registrar Mr Brad Eddy. The Meeting with Council re our vision as per our last newsletter. Fraudulent Stones. The CHRC 2022 Vision update and the Myminesonline review.

Forms were available at the door to "Have your say" and all questions from the floor were answered.

Your Committee were highly impressed by the orderly conduct of all patrons at this meeting, and wish to thank you all sincerely for your co-operation and participation.

On the 30<sup>th</sup> April your Executive attended a meeting with DNR & M including the Safety Inspector, CHRC's – Keith Jarratt (CHRC- Ranger Services re: Miners Common Cattle) Member for Gregory- Lachlan Millar and the Anakie Police. Apologies to this meeting were SLAM and EHP Departments.

Points of note for Members to come out of this meeting were: Safety inspections can be conducted at your Mine without prior notification. Inexperienced underground Miners are given the opportunity to attend a safety brief by Department of Mines Safety Inspector. Temporary stockyards are in the planning stage to be built at Rubyvale, plans & maps are to be sent to the QSMA Inc by Central Highlands Regional Council's Keith Jarratt if and when this proposal to State Government is approved.

Of those various bodies who attended, several issues were discussed with satisfactory outcomes, others are still a work in progress.

Due to the absence of SLAM & EHP Departments many pressing issues were not addressed at this meeting. A further meeting is planned for mid to late July with the relevant bodies.

#### **Topics Pressing:**

Various topics that are currently being addressed are: Deeds of Grant for Freehold and Leasehold tenures and its impact on Mining and Prospecting, Prospecting & Pegging Permits and Landholder/Miner Conduct. The issue of the ERE over the Miners Common Land. The dedicated Road from Sapphire to Reward/Sultana Hill area for safety purposes be repaired to at least prior Flood condition.

A community statement may be needed in the near future to petition Central Highlands Regional Council /State Government for these repairs. This dedicated road access is highly necessary for Miners and Tourists at Reward/Sultana Hill in any emergency.

It's the one that stops me doing my job properly, because the hard hat gets in the way, and those safety glasses just steam up. Then there's the signs. How stupid are those? Nobody reads them anyway!"

Decades ago, before the 'invention' of health and safety at work policies, accidents would injure, maim and kill people on a regular basis. ## **SMALL SCALE MINING PLATFORM**

# Bill to cut red tape for small-scale miners

The State Government has introduced legislation that aims to boost small-scale mining operations in Queensland.

Natural Resources Minister Andrew Cripps says opal and other gemstone exploration is the lifeblood of some regional communities.

Mr Cripps has told State Parliament the bill will simplify applications and remove administrative processes and fees for some small operators.

"These small-scale miners have faced increasing pressure from a steady increase in fees compliance costs and red tape over many years, which has driven down participation in the industry

"The reforms I am introducing today address these issues and will reduce ongoing administrative processes and fees for the industry."

Central Queensland gem miners have welcomed the State Government cuts to red tape for small mining operators.

More than 85 per cent of mining claims in the state are in the Gemfields in central Queensland.

The Queensland Sapphires Producers Association (QSPA) now **QSMA** says red tape has been draining small mining businesses.

QSPA now **QSMA** president Cliff Mortley said it will also benefit tourist operations in the Gemfields.

"We anticipate quite a boost to the small-scale mining platform," he said.

"It's got to be beneficial obviously to the Gemfields area but I mean mainly the Gemfields are a unique location being the largest sapphire fields in the Southern Hemisphere.

"I think at this stage it will entice tourists, which means the tourist industry grows."

Mr Mortley said it will give small miners a chance to take back some of the profits.

"We were being tied in with the large-scale mining - coal - and it was identified then that we were being over-regulated," he said.

"We still need to be regulated but there was a lot of red tape and there was a lot of documentation obviously and costs of course associated with that, which was basically detrimental to small-scale mining."

#### Why was the Gemfields left out?

The Gemfields has for some years now been trying to have a Small Scale Mining Platform for the purpose of Sapphire Mining. After sending submission after submission to the relevant government bodies we are still no further advanced.

**Continued Over** 

The Gemfields is unique in that it supports several different mining tenements.

Level 2 Mining. Predominantly alluvial machinery mining of deeper ground.

Underground Mining. 900 sq. mtr. Mining claim working at an average depth of 20ft. to 30ft.

Surface Mining. 900 sq. mtr. Mining claim working ground to shallow for shaft sinking.

Fossicking. Areas set aside allowing anyone to work the ground to a depth of 2mtrs. On a Fossicking Licence.

We are also unique in that we have itinerant miners, hobby miners, tourist miners and of course fair dinkum miners.

I ask you, with the different levels and types of mining happening on the Central Queensland Gemfields how can we be expected to comply with rules and regulations designed for Level One Mining.

#### What We Require.

- 1. First and for most we would like to have the rules and regulations we have to comply with be tailored to Sapphire Mining rather than being lumped under the Quarrying Act.
- 2. The Central Queensland Gemfields has been a mining field since it was gazetted as The Anakie Mineral Field on 03 Sept. 1902.

Having an ERE within this area is detrimental to mining, tying up much sapphire bearing ground. This also has a huge effect on tourism.

Not to mention inconsistent mapping of the ERE makes it almost impossible to know where and where not one can mine.

3. Popularity of the Gemfields has grown and more people have taken up Mining Tenures the need for more ground esculates. Allowing freehold properties to quarantine ground in regards to the 100mtr. Rule is not only detrimental to our existence as miners but is discriminatory as the freeholder can choose to allow friends to peg within the quarantined 100mtrs.

A fossicking licence allows the holder to dig at a depth of 2mtrs right up to the boundary of a freehold property.

4. With ground becoming harder to find more areas are being pegged that are harder to mine under the present regulations. Ground that has an average depth of between 2mtrs and 4mtrs on a mining tenure at present must be worked by hand.

We would like to be able to either use or hire a machine to remove the excess of overburden to be able to access the wash.

5. Being required to pay a surety bond on a mining tenure it is paramount in order to budget costs that the miner has access to an itemised accounting of how the amount of bond is calculated.

A miner must be able to know the costs in advance to be able to decide to proceed or not.

6. The Gemfields Mining Field. Its uniqueness is that in 1914 all unoccupied Crown Land within the Anakie Mineral Field was gazetted as a Miners Common.

Continued Over

Nearly all unrest of the Gemfields Community can be traced back to the regulations of the Miners Common.

It is impossible to follow the rules unless first you know what they are!

Our Miners Common is getting smaller all the time due to land being used for various developments. There are serious concerns and anger between Graziers and Miners as since the Miners Common was brought into existence land that was part of the common has been sold off reducing the gazetted area.

It is imperative that we know what the laws, regulations and true boundaries are of the Gemfields Miners Common.

All correspondence to Government Departments in relation to the Miners Common has been unproductive.

Our Legal Representative has stated that the original Proclamation still stands therefore it would appear that there are some serious ramifications in regards to what has been allowed to happen by government on the Miners Common!

This is an ongoing problem and as you can see the above concerns have been debated for too long.

Its time to resolve these issues once and for all. We need answers and we need them now!

# THE MINERS COMMON

#### A PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honourable Sir ARTHUR MORGAN, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Queensland and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, and President of the Legislative Council of the said State.

#### ARTHUR MORGAN

Lieutenant-Governor.

In pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested and In accordance with the provisions of "The

Mining Act of 1898," 62 Victoria No. 24, I, Sir ARTHUR MORGAN, the Lieutenant-Governor aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, Do by this my Proclamation, notify and proclaim that all Crown lands Comprised within the limits of the Anakie Mineral Field, except such lands as have for the time being been taken up, and are for the time being occupied, used, or held under or by virtue of any miner's right or business licence, or licence to mine for coal, or under or by virtue of any lease, application for lease or licence from the Crown, shall be a Miner's Common.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Brisbane,

This nineteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one

Thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's Reign.
